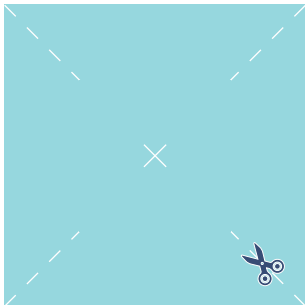


INSTRUCTIONS FOR DIY PAPER WINDMILL

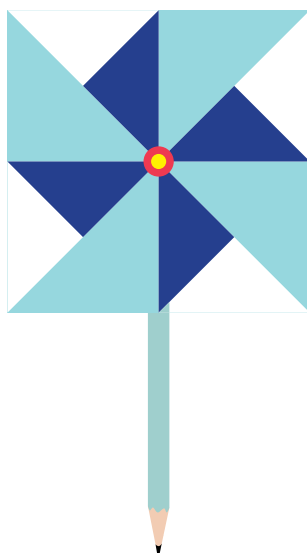
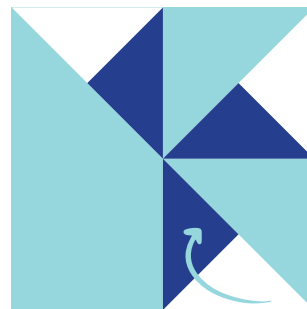
you will need :

- a sheet of **paper** cut into a square or print the pattern (page 4) in this file and one of the guideline sheets (choose between page 2 or 3) if needed (any A4 will do if you don't have a printer).
- **scissors**
- **glue** (glue stick works fine)
- a **pin** (I used a thumbtack which I thought works better as it is easier to handle)
- a **pencil** with a rubber at the end (easier!), a **balsa stick or dowel** if you have, or even a **straight-ish stick!**
- supervise your children with the use of scissors and you will have to put the pin in as a little more skill is required for that part



1/ get your square piece of paper and cut along the dotted lines

2/ fold in alternate corner to the middle and stick each corner one by one with glue (dark blue is the back of your piece of paper - pattern side if you have printed it) so they overlap a little, you can take the cross in the middle as a reference.



3/ optional: you can add a round piece of paper in the middle (red circle) to secure and make it pretty!

4/ **!ADULT TASK HERE!** push the pin (yellow circle) through the middle of your windmill and into the rubber (of your pencil - careful here not to go through and through as it can hurt) or your wooden or balsa stick/dowel. Leave a gap between the stick and the paper so it can turn freely.
